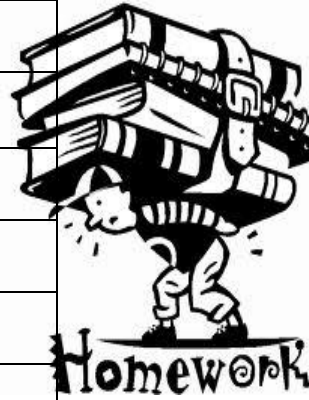

Regular verbs are verbs that use the same base verb in all of the tenses: present, past, and future.

Present Tense

When the pronoun is third person **singular**, we need to add an **s** to a regular verb

Example:

He (stir) **stirs** the chocolate pudding.



With verbs that end in **sh, ch, x, z, or ss**, we add **es** instead of **s**. The **es** sound makes the verb easier to pronounce.

Example:

1. I wash my hands before every meal.
He wash**es** dishes for his mother.
2. They reach for the pumpkin pie.
He reach**es** for the mincemeat pie.
3. They fix their house up for the holidays.
Mother fix**es** dinner for us every night.
4. Bees buzz around their hives.
My alarm clock buzz**es** very early in the morning.
5. Cats hiss when they are afraid.
My cat hiss**es** when she sees a dog.
